
2023 OBT Eitaikyo Service

Excerpts from the book: Jodo Shinshu a Guide

Bodhi Day (Jodo-e) – December 8

This is the day to commemorate Sakyamuni Buddha's attainment of Awakening. According to legend, the historic event took place on December 8, as the first faint light of day began to glow in the eastern sky. By his example, Sakyamuni demonstrated that it was possible for man to become a Buddha—a fully Awakened Person. All human beings, therefore, are in possession of this potentiality—Buddha-Nature—which, when awakened and cultivated, enables them to achieve supreme wisdom and compassion. This day signifies the dawn of humanity's universal emancipation from suffering and unawareness.

Year End Service (Joya-e) – December 31

This service is held at all temples on New Year's Eve to express gratitude for the past year and to reflect on the interdependency of all life, and on all things that have made it possible for one to live through the year.

Though not an activity at Honzan (*editor's note: Nishi Honganji*), temples with a large bell called *bonsho* will toll the bell 108 times on New Year's Eve. This is called *joya no kane* or "bell of the last night." It is the symbolic ringing away for the 108 passions that afflict human beings and bind them to the world of delusion. It is a reminder of the need to free oneself from the entanglements of self-centeredness as one faces the New Year. There is no way to know whether the coming year will be fortunate or unfortunate, but in the Nembutsu, whichever it is, everything will be all right.

Kitchen Reminder Carolyn Saiget

Do you use the temple kitchen?

PLEASE help us keep our kitchen a CLEAN and SAFE place for everyone.

If you use the **gas burners**, be sure to check that all burners are off and the main gas valve is returned to the off position. It is not safe to leave the valve left in the "on" position!

If you turn on the **dishwasher**, make sure you wipe it down, drain it, and properly shut it down.

If you put something in the **refrigerator** or **freezer**, keep in mind that they are not used on a regular basis. Label and date food items left behind. Take home or dispose of items that have a short shelf life or will spoil. Remove all compost and garbage to the bins outside.

Empty the **buckets of bleach solution**. Bring dirty towels to the annex for washing.

If you use either of the **walk in refrigerators**, remember to shut them off and leave them propped open.

Our temple relies on every person who uses our facility to treat it as if it was their own home. We do not have a janitor or housekeeper. Thank you for doing your share (and then some) to help keep our kitchen a **CLEAN** and **SAFE** space for everyone.


